

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The Month of June has arrived. While the calendar says Summer is not yet here the thermometer says otherwise. Temperatures are in the upper nineties and will be the norm for the next few months. Dry conditions continue and wildfires have occurred at River Ranch and Lake Wales. Polk County has instituted a Burn Ban effective May 28th. Please visit polk-county.net for updates and information.

June 1st is also officially recognized as the beginning of Hurricane Season from now thru November the potential for extreme weather is possible. NOAA our National Weather Service is forecasting a very active season with 17 to 25 named storms with 8 to 13 Hurricanes and possibly 4 to 7 being Major which are category 3 or higher. The time to plan and prepare is now. The State of Florida is having tax free days from June 1st to June 14th. This exemption is for all Hurricane supplies from batteries to generators and even covers some pet supplies for our furry companions. I would advise everyone to take advantage of this break to purchase those items you may need. Parkways under the direction of Tim Underwood will work in conjunction with Parkways Director Juan Lopez in developing a continuous strategy to address any actions from tree trimming to ditch clearing and securing anything that can be carried by high winds. This same plan should be followed by all homeowners to protect their properties. The Business Office will provide continuing updates on Our message Boards, Facebook Page and email blasts as new information becomes available.

As I'm sure everyone has noticed, the palm trees on Park Avenue are being replaced from the gate to the Lakefront. Many of the existing trees are dying of disease or leaning over to the point a good wind can bring them down. While there are those who consider this a waste of funds, that's far from the truth. We have a responsibility to continue to make Indian Lake Estates more attractive to people who might consider building here. Also, the New Palms will not require yearly trimming saving man hours and equipment costs. In the long run these savings will cover the cost of the trees. The Board of Directors will continue to improve and beautify Indian Lake Estates whenever and wherever we can and as cost effectively as possible. There is still much work to be done and The Board of Directors will continue to work diligently to that end.


ILE SECURITY INFORMATION

For Owners/Guests to operate gate: (Prior to use, resident must contact office and have their phone number added to the security program) Scroll to your name. Key in the four digit code. Phone will ring, answer, dial 9 then hang up.

- ATTENTION: POLK BURN BAN NOW IN EFFECT A mandatory burn ban is now in effect in Polk County as of Tuesday, May 28, 2024. The burn ban will remain in effect until the Keetch-Byram Drought Index (KBDI) drops below 500 for consecutive days or until further notice.
- Gate arms are now active (No tailgating)
- If you have any police emergency such as theft, burglary, suspicious vehicles or persons, you
 must contact the Sheriff's office directly and file a report.

Effective immediately and per the Polk County Sheriff's Office, the CAPS patrol will not longer be permitted to complete house checks. If you are going away, we recommend you contact a friend or neighbor to keep an eye on your house.




