The Board of Directors continues to work on improving and beautifying Indian Lake Estates. Our audit was conducted, and the final numbers should be available mid-month to help us understand what monies are available to spend. While the budgets were approved, we must remain diligent to spend wisely and not compromise our financial stability.

In closing I have always tried to be positive when writing these messages unfortunately this month there has been a rash of incidents of wanton and deliberate destruction of Indian Lake Estates and residents' property. This behavior cannot and will not be tolerated. The business manager is working in conjunction with Polk County Sheriffs to come up with a plan and strategy to address this situation. 








Handicap Ramp



The benefits of Irrigation moving forward will reap many rewards for Community. The Pro Shop Manager Robin Samson announced starting May 1st to October 3rd rates for 18 -holes- \$25 and 9 -holes -\$17 tax included.
